"Canadian Genealogist" was published quarterly by Generation Press from 1979 to 1988 under the editorship of George and Elizabeth Hancocks. Contributing editors included W. E. Britnell (Ontario), Eileen Hall (Michigan), Eric Jonasson (Manitoba), J. A. McAndless (Ontario), T. M. Punch (Nova Scotia) and John Ruch (Quebec), as well as Lynn Morgan. The goal of the magazine was to publish "records, resources, genealogies, pedigrees, and biography ... [and] to deviate into the related fields of family and local history, ... and perhaps even into social history. ... material of interest to Canadians throughout this huge, yet often regionally isolated country."
