Report on the Spring Social/AGM - April 22, 2017

A small but enthusiastic group of 23 members and guests attended this years' Spring Social/AGM. Anne Redish, Central East Regional Vice-President made the journey up from Kingston to join us. Unfortunately, Branch President Marg Hall was not in attendance due to illness, but, our Vice-President Rosemarie Pleasant picked up the torch and ran with it.

The program changed slightly from previous years as flag-bearer Barry Gilmore was also absent. After a brief introduction by Rosemarie, the toasts to Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II and to King George III were given by Ron Richards, followed by the singing of God Save the Queen. The group then enjoyed an excellent meal supplied by Café 1274.

After the meal, the Annual General Meeting was held. The meeting was called to order at 1:10pm. The minutes on the Annual General Meeting from 2016 had been distributed by secretary Penny Minter. As there were no comments or questions regarding the minutes, it was moved by Bob Adair and seconded by Dorothy Meyerhof that the minutes be accepted as written. **All in favour**.

Bob Adair then presented the 2016 Final Statement of Income and Expenses for the branch. There were several questions concerning the life membership rebate from Dominion Office which is no longer received, fund availability for the 2019 conference and funding for the flag raising. After these questions were satisfactorily responded to, it was moved by Bob Adair and seconded by Dorothy Meyerhof that the financial statement be accepted. **All in favour**.

Gary Bagley, the branch genealogist stated that he is working on one application at present. He also presented a certificate to Penny Minter for her Loyalist ancestor Frederick Shaver.

Dorothy Meyerhof presented her report on the branch library collection which currently stands at 965 titles, 26 periodicals. There have been 27 new titles added since the last AGM. She thanked Sue Moss and Penny Minter for their volunteer work with the City Archives as well as those who have made

donations to the collection. She reminded everyone that donations should be given to her directly and not the Archives as they need to go through triage before being added to the collection. The City of Ottawa Archives holds several collections from various historical societies including Historical Society of Ottawa, BIFHSGO, Ottawa Branch OGS, C. Robert Craig Memorial Library, United Church Archives as well as our own branch library. Sylvia Powers presented Dorothy with the book "Reporting the Revolutionary War: Before it was History, It was News" by Todd Andrlik for the collection.

Sylvia Powers then gave a brief update on the plans for the 2019 Dominion conference which is being hosted by SGC Branch. The organizing committee is hoping to have a reception at Rideau Hall on Thursday. There will be presentations and a banquet on Friday and Saturday nights. The committee is looking for suggestions for possible speakers as well as donations for a silent auction. Beth Sweetnam briefly mentioned that the committee is considering Christ Church Aylmer for the Sunday church service. This church is the oldest church in the area and is celebrating its' 175th anniversary this year.

Anne Redish, Central East Regional Vice-President then spoke on the challenges which all branches are facing at this time and encouraged everyone to consider thinking outside the box when it comes to attracting new members. She mentioned that Kingston Branch will be holding the Annual Regional meeting on June 20, 2017 and encouraged everyone to attend. There will be a genealogy research speaker as well as mini workshops and brainstorming sessions. Anne also mentioned that those not attending the conference in London could vote by proxy. The information on how to do this is on the Dominion website, uelac.org.

There were no elections at this years' AGM as the current officers who must be elected remain the same. Thus, concluded the Annual General Meeting.

Nancy Richards then introduced our guest speaker, Romaine Honey who is a Local History and Genealogy Librarian at Ottawa Public Library. Her topic was Ottawa Public Library: Treasures for Genealogists. Romaine began her presentation with a brief introduction to the OPL web page and explained that there are over 50 online resources available to library patrons. Although some are only accessible through the library on-site (Ancestry, Généalogie Quèbec), several are available from the comfort of your own home (Early Canadiana Online, Globe & Mail Historical). Romaine also mentioned the numerous print resources available to genealogists such as census records, family histories, passenger lists, historical atlases and local & county histories to name but a few.

After her presentation, she was thanked by Bob Adair who then presented her with a cheque for the Ottawa Public Library genealogy collection.

The singing of O Canada concluded the afternoon and the meeting was adjourned at 2:30.

The Capital Calls Loyalists conference is drawing nearer. While it is still 2 years away, a lot has been accomplished so far. The Doubletree Hilton Gatineau-Ottawa has been booked. The rates given us are better than the rates for the hotel in London for this year's conference so I am glad that we have a contract that is firm so far ahead. For the same rate, we can have a room with 2 Queen-sized beds and a sofa, a king-sized bed with an extra sitting room and 2 TVs, or 2 Queen-sized beds. Book yours early to get the style you want. Elder Albert Dumont will welcome us to Algonquin Territory at the reception on Thursday night. On New Year's Eve he was honoured to light the eternal flame at parliament hill. In January he received the DreamKeepers Citation for Outstanding Leadership at the Martin Luther King celebrations sponsored by the City of Ottawa. Since October 2016 Albert has been serving his community as one of 13 Elders on the Elders Advisory Committee of the Ministry of the Attorney General. He worked as Elder for the

Parole Board of Canada at Elder Assisted Hearings from November 2013 to March 2017. He was employed by Correctional Services Canada for three years as a spiritual advisor for the Aboriginal men incarcerated at Millhaven Institution's J Unit located near Kingston, ON. He is an activist, a volunteer and a poet who has published 5 books of poetry and short stories. In recognition for his work as an activist and volunteer on his ancestral lands (Ottawa andRegion) Albert was presented with a Human Rights Award by the Public Service Alliance of Canada in 2010.

Albert has dedicated his life to promoting Aboriginal spirituality and healing and to protecting the rights of Aboriginal Peoples particularly those as they affect the young. You may learn more about him by going to his website Turtle Moons Contemplations.

Plans are being made for tours on Friday. Brian Tackaberry will be the guide for the Rideau Valley Tour. Many other options are being considered for the Ottawa area.

Speakers are still being considered for the Friday and Saturday banquets. One of the Saturday afternoon presenters could be Marilyn Schwartz who has a slide presentation of the historical statues on Parliament Hill.

George MacManus who has attended our socials a number of times has agreed to be our treasurer with Barry Gilmore as co-treasurer.

The Quilt of Belonging has 263 squares representing 71 Aboriginal groups and 192 immigrant nationalities found in Canada. The finished quilt measures 36 metres (120 feet) long by 3.5 metres (10 feet) high.

The quilt is the dream of Esther Bryan, an artist who had a great vision. This project had hundreds of volunteers to complete the quilt and many more volunteers as it travels to special exhibitions, like the one we are fortunate to have in the City of Ottawa as part of Canada 150.

For me personally, I watched the quilt being made and I have been fortunate to see it six times and plan to see it at OTTAWA CITY HALL.


